
practice of romantic adventure (which concept will also be developed below) should also be centered—at least it social regulation—in and around these institutions. All the specialists and scholars cooperating in the program would be given equal statuses but only if they promoted the interests and goals of the program. The first objective would be to adapt the American people to the nuclear age by securing leadership in the field of pure science and attaining cultural leadership.

Editor's Note: Baranski was making these predictions in 1960 and, obviously, the future he idealised 45–50 years ago can now be seen not to have materialised. And, of course, the important thing here is to see the field of science progressing in the way that Baranski envisioned.

^{**} These are examples of the concepts with which each cultural era attempted to explain the three basic problems; the origin and operation of the physical universe, the biological processes and the social group. Thus, each cultural era was interested in these fundamental problems but each employed different types of explanatory hypotheses to deal with these problems. The lines indicate the increasing veridicality of concepts. Note that all four cultural eras exist to this day telescoped into the present.
